Emergency Kit Procedures Form: Insect Sting or Allergy**

The Northside Independent School District will allow the school nurse to administer emergency injections to the student involved if there is a known hypersensitivity and the emergency kit is on campus. The child may give his/her own injection, in the absence of the nurse, if the student has been taught.

Other campus personnel, previously identified as capable of giving injections, will give the emergency injection if the nurse is absent and the child cannot give it to him/her self.

The school nurse will follow physician orders received for each student and administer emergency medications as written. The child who has an allergic reaction with an unknown trigger will be observed and treated by NISD staff per orders received after communicating with the NISD medical consultant.

The Northside Independent School District can give the emergency medications, as outlined above, if the following form is completed by the child's physician.

The following steps will be followed as ordered by private physician or NISD medical consultant:

1. Give injection of epinephrine (dose) _____.
2. Give _____ orally
at once. Medication and dose
1. Call parent/guardian or EMS.
2. Remove stinger if present.
3. Use ice pack over site.
4. Make arrangements to have student transported to emergency room or doctor's office.
5. Give second dose of epinephrine after 30 minutes if child is still on campus.
